## Role of a Child Protection Worker

Child Protection Workers provide an invaluable service to the community, working in the areas of child protection and children and young people in care.

They are responsible for investigating serious concerns about the welfare and safety of children and young people and make recommendations for action appropriate to the situation.

They also provide community education and information that promotes child safety within the family, community and residential settings.

## Qualification requirements

A tertiary qualification in Social Work, Psychology or a relevant Human Services area is essential.

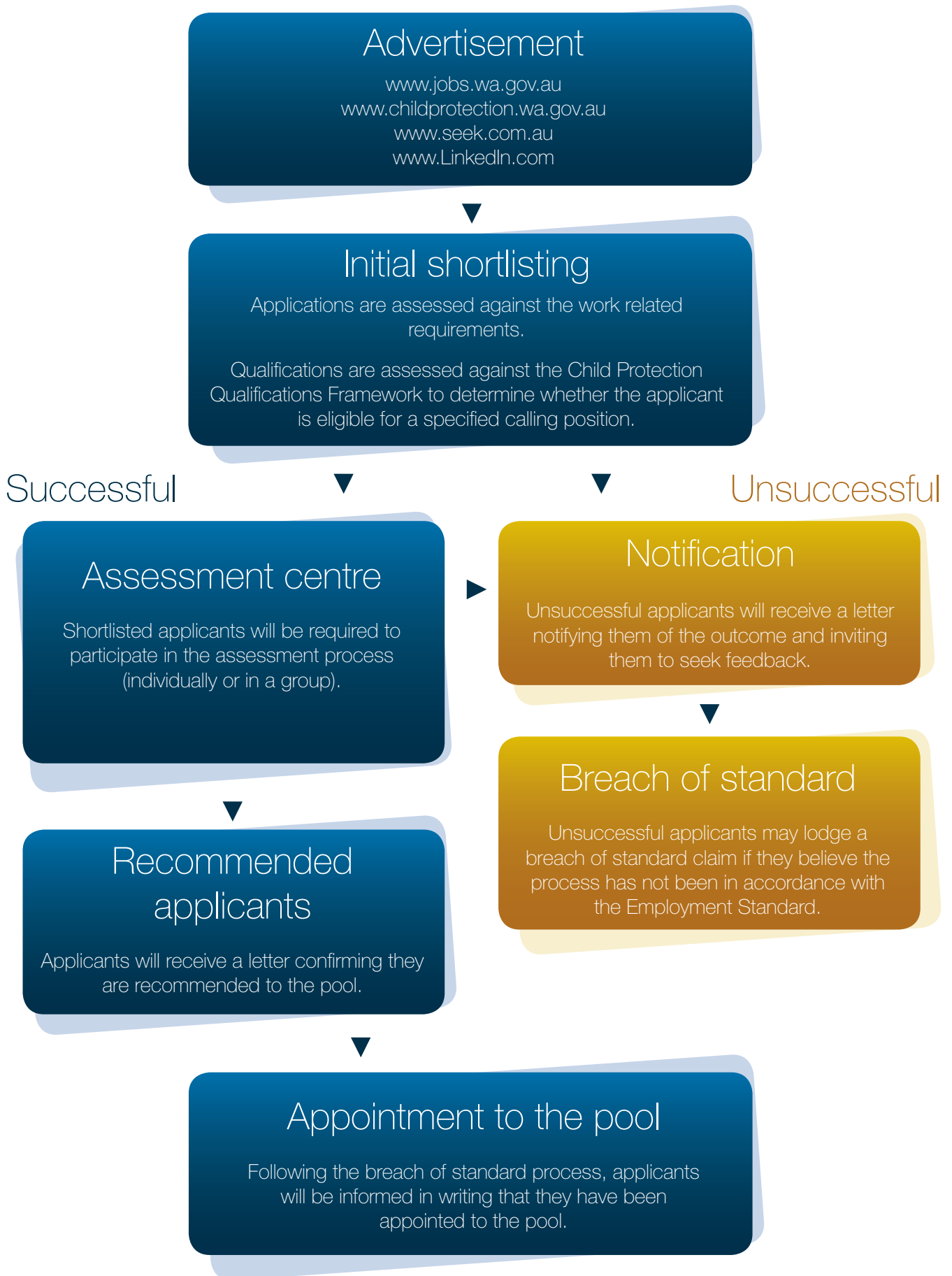
